
Youth In Action

A howling good time was had by all at KCPR's first ever full moon night hike! Our family and senior hikes offered throughout the year are a great time for new and seasoned hikers alike.


FALL FEST

Field Upgrades

In 2025 KCPR invested in upgrades to softball and baseball fields. From backstops to fencing, mounds to dugouts, and shades to team benches, Kent County sluggers were ready to hit the new fields in both Worton and Toal Parks.

Sensory Path

We are excited to introduce a new Sensory Path at Worton Park, developed by Eric Fitch from the Maryland SNAP-ED Program and installed by the Department of Public Works. This vibrant, interactive pathway encourages visitors of all ages to explore, move, and engage in activities that promote physical activity, mindfulness, and sensory development.

Beach Tennis Tournament

The ITF Beach Tennis Tournament came to Worton Park on May 3 & 4, featuring professional players and exciting matches. Visitors enjoyed free demos and clinics, trying the sport, sharpening their skills, and exploring the latest equipment.



StoryWalk® at Worton Park
